Elements:	<p>Portcullis – the symbol of Westminster, The crowned portcullis has come to be accepted during the twentieth century as the emblem of both Houses of Parliament. As with many aspects of parliamentary life, this has arisen through custom and usage rather than as a result of any conscious decision.</p> <p>Chains seem to be a very common, though not particularly significant feature accompanying the portcullis.</p> <p>The crown makes it an explicitly royal symbol, acknowledging that the United Kingdom is governed by Her Majesty's Government in the name of the Queen.</p> <p>The typeface is National. The term 'UK Parliament' highlights the key role of Parliament in the UK constitution</p>

Elements: Emblem, made up of:
 Tudor Rose, representing England
 Thistle, representing Scotland
 Leek leaves, representing Wales,
 Flax flower, representing Ireland

These four national elements are embraced by an almost-circular frame representing both Libra, Latin for the scales of justice, and Omega, the last letter in the Greek alphabet, symbolising the final source of justice for the United Kingdom.

The all caps name is set in the font Enigma.

Above all these sits the crown, as the Monarch is the source of The Supreme Court's authority.

Elements: Portcullis – the symbol of Westminster, where the Force was established in 1829. Also a symbol of security and protection

The Tressure flory and counter-flory which surrounds the Portcullis is allusive of the name Scotland Yard

Shield, Lions, Knights Helmet, Crown - probably from British coat of arms?

Holding a Column, which was a device of Cardinal Wolsey in allusion to the tradition of his owning the land known as Scotland.

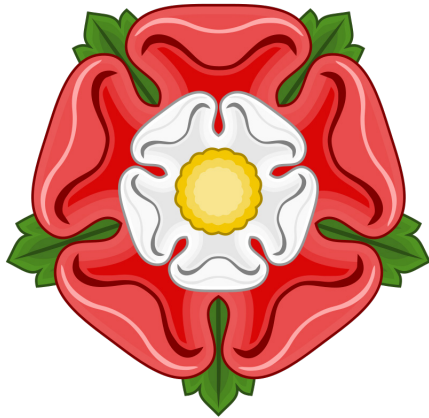

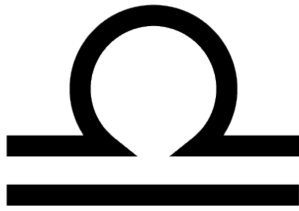
Tudor Rose

- King Henry VII combined the houses of York & Lancaster, therefore combining their roses



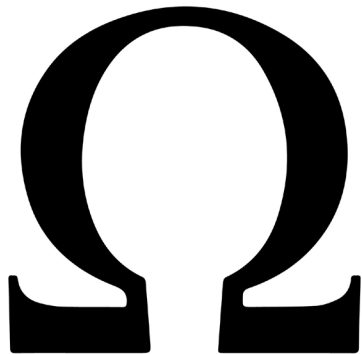
British Coat of Arms

- Ancient Greece

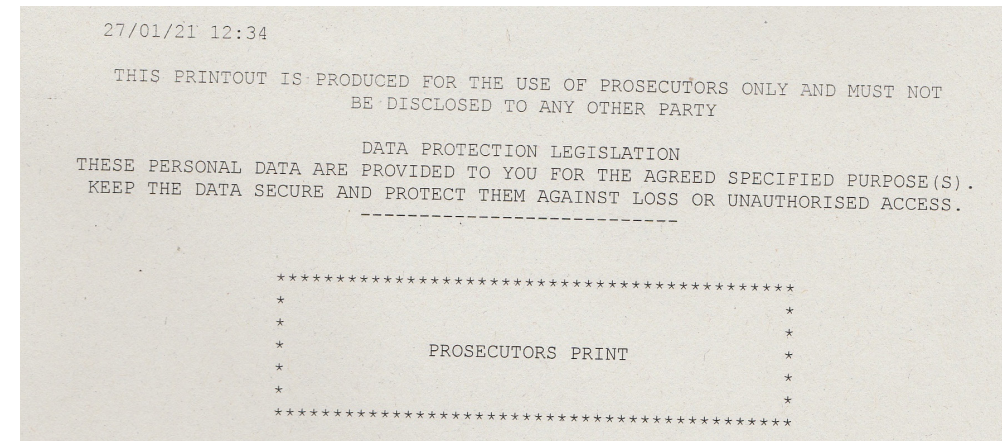


Scales

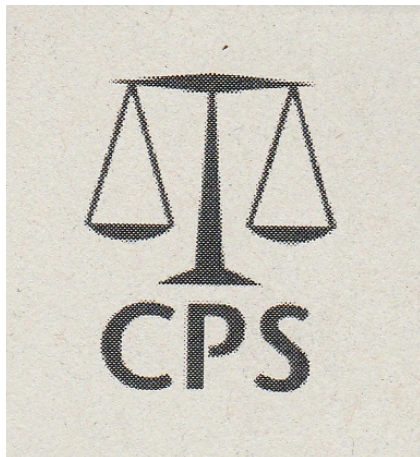
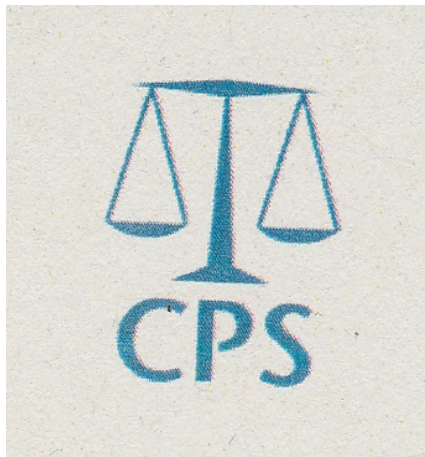
